SUPERVISOR'S REMARKS

Good Evening

It has brought to the Board's attention that commercial businesses have been dumping illegal various items at our town brush drop off site located on Woodchuck Alley. This site is intended for use by our residents, not commercial use. We have cameras on premises to verify the illegal dumping. There is signage there. A fine of \$50.00 has been established. We have options to resolve this issue. Increase the fine to \$1,000.00, put a fence up with a rolling gate, or establish dumping hours for residents with an individual to open and close the gate. We need to address this issue soon.

Supervisor Cammarata – has already updated Mr. Pelky via phone. Steps are being completed. The supervisor is confident the funding will be obtained. It will be the first sewers in Orleans County. The director of REDI is supportive. The website has all updated information. Pumping stations have been obtained, thanks to land donations from Kludt Farms, and Cottages at Troutburg. This project will happen.

Trudy Slocum, Lakeshore Road – Why are Webster and Hamlin all finished with their REDI projects, but Kendall is not?

Supervisor Cammarata answered that the difference is that they got all their money, but we have not. Work is being done all along. Approvals, plans, etc. have been obtained. The magnitude of Kendall's project is huge.

Mrs. Slocum asked if this project is delaying the water project.

Councilwoman Flow and Supervisor Cammarata assured her that the projects, among others, happen simultaneously, and have separate silos of money.

Planning, Zoning & Agriculture – Jennings

Planning heard a request for a property line adjustment for the sawmill on Route 18 and Countyline Roads. That was approved, subject to a survey map being submitted.

Planning also heard a request for a minor adjustment to a property line between two properties owned by family members. That was approved.

Zoning discussed a flag lot situation on Route 18, where a family wishes to build a new, small home on their property to accommodate aging parents. That issue is ongoing.

A resident on Bald Eagle has plans to add a second story to his existing home, which would put the building twenty feet closer to the lake, which would require a variance. The property is in the Coastal Erosion zone.

Michael Maxon on Center Road has requested a permit to run a business renting large equipment, which cannot be housed in a pole barn and so would be visible from the road and to neighbors. That will be discussed further.

Finance, Taxes & Special Districts – Cammarata

The 2024 Budget has been submitted to Real Property. The tax rate was lowered by \$1 per \$1000 assessment.

Orleans County Legislature – John Fitzak

Progress is being made on internet service county-wide.

A shared service meeting is scheduled. Grants will be discussed.

Verizon is testing new equipment designed to improve service near the lake. There is a church in Albion which has a warming shelter available throughout nights below 32 degrees. Cots are offered from evening through morning for those seeking shelter.
