#### RESOLUTIONS

Martin made the following motion, which was seconded by Flow:

### RESOLUTION 64-0624 BUDGET AMENDMENT JCAP GRANT

BE IT RESOLVED, to increase General Revenue Account A2770.31 JCAP Grant, \$6,669.95, and increase General Expense Account A1110.41, Grant Contractual, by \$6,669.95.

Supervisor Cammarata called for a vote, which resulted in all ayes, and declared the motion carried.

Flow made the following motion, which was seconded by Jennings:

# RESOLUTION 65-0624 BUDGET TRANSFERS ASSESSOR & TOWN HALL EQUIPMENT

BE IT RESOLVED, to decrease General Expense Account A1355.12, Assessor Extra Help, by \$150.39 and to increase General Expense Account A1355.40, Assessor Contractual Expense, by \$150.39, and

BE IT RESOLVED; to decrease General Expense Account A1620.40, Town Hall Contractual, by \$102.38, and to increase General Expense Account A1620.20, Town Hall Equipment, by \$102.38.

Supervisor Cammarata called for a vote, which resulted in all ayes, and declared the motion carried.

Jennings made the following motion, which was seconded by Bentley:

# RESOLUTION 66-0624 ACCEPTING THE LATERAL RESTRICTIONS GUIDELINE FOR THE KENDALL REDI SEWER PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Town Board of Kendall recognizes the importance of supporting and preserving agricultural land within the county-adopted, State-certified agricultural districts within the Town of Kendall; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board is committed to managing connections to the public sewer system in a manner that supports agricultural uses and protects the integrity of agricultural districts; and

WHEREAS, the Town is undertaking the Kendall REDI Sewer Project, which requires the implementation of lateral restrictions to ensure that connections to the public sewer system are limited to agricultural uses and existing non-farm uses; and

WHEREAS, the Town has prepared a guideline for lateral restrictions to limit connections to the public sewer system to agricultural uses and existing non-farm uses, as outlined in the attached document titled "Lateral Restriction - Conditions on Future Service"; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has reviewed the attached guideline and believes that its adoption is in the best interest of the Town and its residents;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of Kendall as follows:

The Town Board hereby accepts and adopts the guideline titled "Lateral Restriction - Conditions on Future Service," which is attached hereto and made a part of this Resolution.

The only land and/or structures that will be allowed to connect to the proposed sewer within an agricultural district will be:

- 1. Existing structures at the time of construction,
- 2. Future agricultural structures,
- 3. Land and structures that have already been approved for development by the local governing body prior to the date of filing of the Notice of Intent (NOI) to the Department of Agriculture and Markets on May 28, 2024.
- 4. Land and structures approved for development are defined as properties/structures that have been brought before a local governing body and received necessary approvals (e.g., subdivision, site plan, and special permit). If no local approval is required, the municipality accepts the limitation under Public Health Law §1115, which defines a

"subdivision" in part as "any tract of land which is divided into five or more parcels." Sewer service will not be provided to more than four residences, buildings, and/or structures on any tract of land

divided into parcels after the date of filing of the NOI by the municipality where no local approval is required, and the land is located within a county-adopted State-certified agricultural district.

5. In cases of significant hardship demonstrated by an existing resident, the lateral restriction to the resident's property may be removed by the municipality upon approval by the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets (NYSDAM). The resident landowner must clearly demonstrate the need for public sewer service and submit a hardship application approved by the County Department of Health and agreed to by the NYSDAM.

- 6. If a landowner requests the county to remove their land from an agricultural district during district review and the county legislative body refuses, the lateral restrictions may be removed by the municipality if the NYSDAM determines that the removal of the restriction would not have an unreasonably adverse effect on the agricultural district.
- 7. If one more tax parcels are removed from a county-adopted State-certified agricultural district and the district has been reviewed by the county legislative body and certified for modification by the NYSDAM Commissioner, the lateral restrictions imposed by the municipality will no longer be in effect for the parcels of land removed from the agricultural district.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Clerk is hereby directed to enter this resolution into the official minutes of the Town Board.

Supervisor Cammarata called for a vote, which resulted in all ayes, and declared the motion carried.

Bentley made the following motion, which was seconded by Martin:

# RESOLUTION 67-0624 WATER DISTRICT SIX WATER RATE INCREASE

WHEREAS the Town of Murray supplies and delivers the water for the Town of Kendall's Water District Six through an intermunicipal agreement, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Murray has notified the Town Board of the Town of Kendall of significant increases in the rates it pays to Monroe County Water Authority for its water supply, and

WHEREAS, it now becomes necessary to pass these increases on to the Town of Kendall, and so to each benefit user of Water District Six, so

NOW BE IT RESOLVED, that the new water rate for Water District Six customers, effective July 1, 2024, will be \$4.60 per 1,000 gallons of water. The \$15.00 quarterly service fee will remain unchanged.

Supervisor Cammarata called for a vote, which resulted in all ayes, and declared the motion carried.

Councilman Martin moved to accept Abstract Six, as presented, and to pay the claims. Councilwoman Flow seconded the motion, and all were in agreement.
